THE HISTORY OF THE CITY OF BOSTON

FROM THE FIRST SETTLEMENT TO THE PRESENT TIME

1790

The city of Boston, situated on a neck of land between the harbor and the bay, was first settled by a band of Puritan emigrants from England in 1630. The settlement was founded by John Winthrop, who led a group of about 100 families to the new colony. They established a city that was to become one of the most important centers of commerce and industry in the New World. The city grew rapidly, and by the middle of the 17th century it was one of the largest and most prosperous cities in North America.

The city of Boston was the center of the American Revolution. It was here that the first shots were fired on April 19, 1775, at the Battle of Lexington.
