I deployed to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom and the responsible draw down of forces with the Louisiana National Guard. During this deployment as a (NCO) I was responsible for managing and monitoring over 600 convoy security missions. As one of Three Battle NCO's I was responsible for 674 Soldiers, comprised of five Convoy Security Troops, providing convoy escort throughout southern Iraq; responsible for the supervision of 4 Radio Telephone Operators (RTO) and Command Post of the Future (CPOF) operators; daily tasks consist of battle tracking Convoy Protection Platforms (CPPs) providing security for multi-class items using Army Battle Command Systems (ABCS), tracking and reporting Serious Incident Reports (SIRs), Commanders Critical Information Requirements (CCIRs), and advising the Squadron Command Staff of mission status; conducts Morale, Welfare and Mentoring of subordinates through coaching and counseling. I ensured that the convoys were dispatched and missions were closed out properly and according to the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP). These security convoys have traveled over 1,000,000 miles to date since my unit has assumed responsibility of this mission. My duties included requesting and directing MEDEVAC and Quick Reaction Force (QRF) missions. Additional duties included being a Commanders Personal Security Detail. I was responsible for Information Management at the level. Through the everyday use of all computer and radio equipment necessary for my job I was able to become very highly knowledgeable of Microsoft Office programs as well as GPS tracking equipment and radio communications equipment use.

While being in the rank of Specialist or lower I was a primary go to guy for knowledge and skills in use of military radios and communications devices at the Company level. I competed in several gunner competitions in which I was awarded Top Gunner status for my Company. I became very knowledgeable of the many different weapons systems that I would potentially have to use in my career to include the M-4 Carbine, M249 Squad Automatic Weapon, M240B Machine Gun, and the M-2 .50 Caliber Heavy Machine Gun. Towards the end of my tenor at Fort Campbell I was placed in the Supply section and worked as a Supply Assistant to the Supply Sergeant. During this time I became very well versed in the use of Microsoft Office programs as well as the use of the Army Supply System. While working as a Supply Clerk for my unit I was responsible for maintaining accountability of sensitive equipment that was issued to individual soldiers and when needed processing paperwork through the military supply system to initiate charges against individual soldiers pay for loss of assigned equipment. I was also responsible for signing paperwork to pick up new equipment or additional equipment for the Company Commander to be added to the Commanders property book.
