Achievements

2017: I obtained the Hazardous Materials Endorsement from the Transportation Security Administration

2016: I received an honorable withdraw from Teamsters Local 455 Union

2014: I was able to acquire the skills to communicate professionally and effectively with the customers and drivers, read detailed shipping papers such as MSDS, Bill of Laden and weight tickets. I quickly learned to convert measurements for loading and off-loading i.e. A desired fill weight of 70,000 lbs.- weight of the trailer = lbs. of product to be loaded, divided by pounds per gallon of the product, then divided by the circumference of the tank will give you the inches of product to take from the tank in order to reach the desired tanker weight of 70,000 lbs. I was able to quickly advance from the warehouse, to tank farm, to railcar loading and off-loading, to chemical mixing and production while working independently as well as a team.

2013: While driving for All Recycling I found that if we load our trucks 2000 lbs. under DOT maximums (which prevents overweight violations), inflate the tires 3 lbs. over suggested fill and shift to a lower gear at a designated spot up the hill, we would shave an average of 10 minutes off of each of the 6 loads we did a day which immediately cut overtime cost and left us with 60 extra minutes for unexpected traffic and more detailed post trips

I received ENCANA First Responder Training and Certification, Earned Rough Terrain Forklift Certification, I received 32 hours of crane training

2012: While working at Cal Frac Well Services we were met with a dangerous situation where the well was attempting to close while building dangerous amounts of pressure. I was solely running six pumps at all different levels of pressure carefully bumping each pump until given the command over two way radio to cut all pumps simultaneously until the pressure dropped to safe enough levels to repeat the process. I was able to successfully break through the well right as the company man said, "that's it, let's call for a wireline," which is very expensive, time consuming process that isn't guaranteed to work. I received recognition from my supervisors as well as the contracted company for my outstanding work performance

2011: I was the first employee that was sent to the American Truck Driving School by my company instead of using their driver trainer and I graduated commercial Driver License School before time and ahead of my class
