Determination of Eligibility

Reasonings and Findings

Under Minnesota Statute section 268.047, unemployment benefits paid, if any, will not be used in computing the future unemployment tax rate of an employer when the applicant quit without a good reason caused by the employer. A good reason caused by the employer is one directly related to the employment, for which the employer is responsible, and that has such a negative effect on the worker that an average, reasonable worker would quit and become unemployed rather than remain in the employment.

The applicant quit during the week beginning 02/24/2019 without a good reason caused by the employer.

Effect of this Determination

This quit has no effect on the applicant's unemployment benefits, because the applicant earned enough wages in other employment since quitting.

Under Minn. Stat. Section 268.047, subd. 3, any unemployment benefits paid will not be used in computing the future unemployment tax rate of CORPORATE MANAGEMENT GROUP INC.
