To contest the applicant's eligibility or the effect on your account

"Raise an Issue" if there is a reason you think the applicant might not be eligible or that your account should not be charged. Raise the issue **within 10 days** of this determination to avoid unnecessary charges. Common examples of issues raised:

- Unemployed for a reason other than layoff due to lack of work.
- Still working, full or part-time.
- Received or applied for a pension, separation pay, or workers' compensation.
- Not available for work, or not authorized to work.

How to raise an issue

Online (recommended)

1. Log in to your account at www.uimn.org
2. Click *Determinations and Issue Summary*.
3. Locate the applicant.
4. Click the applicant's Social Security number.
5. Follow the instructions to raise an issue.
6. Be prepared to complete a questionnaire giving details about the issue.

Send the front page of this determination and a statement describing the issue you are raising. If we need more information, you will be mailed a questionnaire specific to the issue.



How to correct base period wages

If the base period wages shown are incorrect:

1. Log in to your account at www.uimn.org
2. Click *Tax and Wage Detail Reporting* and then *Adjustment*.
3. Follow the prompts to make the correction.

Changes you make may require you to pay additional Unemployment Insurance taxes.



File an appeal if the applicant was not covered by Unemployment Insurance

File an appeal if you believe the base period wages shown were earned for work not covered by Unemployment Insurance law, such as an independent contractor. For more information, see *Covered / Non-covered Employment* in the Employer Handbook at www.uimn.org

This determination will become final unless a timely appeal is filed. An appeal results in a telephone hearing with an unemployment law judge.

If you decide to file an appeal, it must be postmarked, received by fax, or through your online unemployment insurance account by **Wednesday, January 11, 2017**.
