**WAREHOUSE CLERK:** My last employer was Westrock . My position there was the warehouse clerk/material handler. MY duties consisted of keeping track of inventory, location, piece count, where it was used or where it was needed. I had to make sure each job had enough parts to complete the job, pulling parts and staging them for orders. If something was missing, I had to find out where it went and fix the issue so that part is not available. Driving a stand-up deep reach, take parts and issuing them to the lines, returning parts and putting them in the racks. Taking finished good and putting them in location for the other company to put them into their inventory. Taking product and issuing it to the lines it is running on. Making sure each line has enough parts and that there is no down time. Used computer, RF scanner and VMUs.

**FORKLIFT DRIVER:** I worked for Prologistix for about a year. My position was forklift driver for UPG, Genco and Menahsa through Prologistix. My duties were picking orders to be shipped to the customer, case picking and full pallets. Replenished empty bins for case picking. Staged order in specific areas to be shipped. Used RF scanner, computer and VMUs. Drove stand up deep reach and walkie.

I have a total of 5 years warehouse experience before Prologistix and Westrock. I worked for Lanter in the Hershey division for about 2 years. I was an order picker at first then become a replenisher for the product for the pickers. From there I became inventory control where I used computer, RF scanner, etc. My duties were looking for missing product, receiving pallets and keeping things updated.

**CONSTRUCTION:** For the next 11 yrs I went into the construction business with my brother-in-law. We started out as handy men for Orkin. We tore out and replaced damaged materials. Then we went into the siding business. My duties consisted of setting up ladders and pick board, cutting the siding to the right measurements, soffit and fascia, insulation, flashing and so on. From siding we went to windows. The company we worked for was Window World. We removed the old window, wood, aluminum and steel. We also did sliding glass doors, bay windows, crank windows, etc.. Once the window was in, we would wrap the windows with aluminum cap on the outside of the window. Different job every day which kept the job interesting.

**STEEL WORKER:** I have 5 years experience in steel fabrication, warehouse Huntco Steel I was there about 2 years. I started out as a sheet packager, ran overhead crane, in which I unloaded the machine and loaded truck that was shipping out. I became an inventory specialist, which involved keeping track of the location the material was stored, finding lost materials, staging orders that were shipping, find coil for the orders that are running. I worked at steel work for about 6 months where I did set up the the slitter and drove the forklift.

The most recent in steel fabrication is Robinson Steel. I was with this company for over 2 years. My job duties were shipping and receiving clerk. I ran the overhead crane and loaded trucks all day. To this day, I still hold the record which was 38 trucks in 8 hrs. I was also an inventory control specialist where I did the same duties as at Huntco Steel.

**RESTAURANT BUSINESS:** While in high school i started working at Ponderosa as a dishwasher. Then I went to McDonald's where I was a cook. My duties were preparing the food for lunch and dinner, fries, burgers, nuggets, fish filets, etc. I worked there for 6 months and then went to Hardees where I worked until I graduated high school. My duties were prepping food for next day sales, cooked meals to order, made fried chicken and homemade biscuits, cleaned the fryer, coolers, etc. Equipment used was flat grill, fryers, bun toasters, ovens and good warmers. I also worked for Shoney's and Denny's as a cook performing the same duties.

Right out of High School, I went to work for R.K. Stratman, Harley Davidson's silk screen printing shop. We made everything from baby onesies to men shirts. My duties were to set up the screen for that order. Some were very easy and some were very hard. I was with them about 2 years.

My skills that I am very good at is inventory control specialist, forklift driver, overhead crane operator, math, wrapping windows, shipping and receiving, and being a cook.
