I Received Funds Into My PayPal Account. If you owe PayPal money for any reason (such as you have a negative balance), PayPal will attempt to collect the debt from you. For harder-to-collect debt, IC System's Premier Collect Plan, provides credit reporting to the major credit bureaus, credit monitoring, attorney referral services and litigation referral services if legal action is necessary. If you owe PayPal money, PayPal will try to collect the money from you. However, if you enroll in PayPal's Money Market, you will be able to receive interest on your PayPal balance. Once a creditor deposits or cashes a full payment check, even if they strike out the words "payment in full" or writes, "I don't agree" on the check, they can't come after you for the balance. Sometimes the original creditor will have incomplete information on its computer and will mistakenly sell a debt that has previously been paid or settled. Once it receives your letter, it may not contact you again-except to acknowledge there will be no further contact or the creditor intends to take some specific action, such as a collection action through the courts. They don't normally take the items straight away, and will give you the chance to make payments towards the debt in what's called a 'controlled goods agreement'.

Although some collection agencies provide this information to you, they are not required by law to advise you of this. To that effect, there is an abundance of case law across the country which states even receiving multiple calls a day, in and of itself, does not violate either statute cited above. So if the debtor keeps borrowing at this point, the debt and interest accumulation may accelerate and he or she will be dealing with debt collectors and creditors even more. Probably the most notorious situation when dealing with debt collectors and collectors is the onslaught associated with telephone calls each and every day additionally a few hours in the evening. A collection agency may call you and send you letters in an attempt to collect a debt almost indefinitely.

That's the letter you write and send to the debt collector, via certified mail with a return receipt request, disputing the debt. If a debt collector believes that you owe money, it may begin an arbitration proceeding against you by sending you an arbitration notice in the mail or through a delivery service. If the arbitrator issues an award stating that you owe money, the debt collector must go to court and ask it to "confirm" the award as a court judgment before it can collect on the arbitration award. Send your documents by certified mail, and request a return receipt: it's proof of what the forum or the collector received and when. They are also not allowed to send documents that look like it came from a court or attorney. Look at each forum's website, and any documents or publications the forums will give you. Finally, take notes and keep a record of every interaction you have with the caller - this will support your case if you decide to make a claim under the FDCPA.

The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act is a federal law enacted to control the debt collection process and protect debtors from abusive conduct by debt collectors. An organization adds controls, such as quality control monitoring of debt collection phone calls and correspondence and supervisor approval of payment plans and settlements, to ensure consumers are treated appropriately. You also have the legal right to demand proof that you owe the debt; if the collection agency cannot prove you owe the original credit card debt they must cease all collection efforts. In addition, few debtors truly understand their rights well enough to defend those rights in court without help. While some collection agencies will proceed with the lawsuit even after you file an Answer, few will do so if you state a solid defense you plan to use at the hearing. While merely taking the time to fill out and file an Answer with the court lowers your risk of the lawsuit going any further (more on that in a minute), it doesn't provide you with airtight protection from a collection judgment. If you don't file an Answer with the court within the time frame specified in the paperwork, you're classified as a no-show. As I mentioned yesterday, collection agencies that file a lawsuit against you do so in the hope that you won't respond and the company will subsequently win a default judgment against you. Debt collectors know that filing a lawsuit without legal assistance is daunting for most people. Exceptions are made for people who cannot take personal calls due to the nature of their job or working environment. Collectors rarely "drop" debts because there are no federal guidelines that establish what does and does not constitute legitimate validation.

The intent behind the FDCPA was to prohibit abusive collections practices, not to outlaw foreclosures when there is an express security agreement and breach of an obligation. The dissent finds determinative the distinction between a consumer's obligation to pay money and a deed of trust, which is not itself an obligation to pay money but rather a mechanism by which property is transferred in the event the money is not paid.<sup>56</sup> But in the past we have taken a more functional approach. To say that mortgage foreclosures are debt collection is not to say, as the dissent would have it, that all enforcement of security interests is debt collection, thus making the definition's reference to security interests redundant.<sup>73</sup> The FDCPA defines "debt" as a consumer's "obligation." Lemberg Law is dedicated to making collectors pay when they violate the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act or the Telephone Consumer Protection Act. For that reason, it's important to pursue other simpler ways of dealing with debt collectors before suing. Don't give any of your personal information, like your Social Security number, birth date, or financial account numbers to anyone unless you know who you're dealing with.
