

Can A Third Party Debt Collector Sue Me

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In cases where a family member misrepresented themselves to be the person who owes the debt and the debt collector unintentionally provided information about the debt to the family member based on this representation, courts have found that the collector did not violate the Act. Can only contact your family member once unless they request that he calls back or if he reasonably believes that the family member has new information about your location. However, there are limitations on when they can contact you and the number of times they can do so. There are laws governed by the The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA) that limit how often and who they can call, what they can legally say, and how they can say it. This statement must also make it clear that the creditor can consider a debt to be valid if a consumer does not submit a dispute on the claim within the designated time period. While you may be able to nail them for harassment for that, they can still claim they considered it proper validation - leaving them free to legally validate your debt to the credit bureaus. The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act notes that, once a debtor sends a debt validation request, the collection agency cannot legally validate the debt to any entity other than the consumer that requested the validation until after it has sent proper validation to the consumer. This behavior runs counter to the Fair Debt Collections Practices Act of 1978, which provides harsh penalties against collectors who violate the law. As statutes of limitation expire on the debts owed by whoever the collectors are trying to reach, most debt collectors will stop trying to collect. Collectors want to get you on the phone, and if the debt isn't yours, you don't want to give them any more information than they already have. As with debt collectors though, there are bad operators. Another method for credit card debt settlement is to technique the creditors yourself.

No one wants to live worrying about the next call coming in to their cell phone or office line. For instance, some debtors will get harassing phone calls late into the night or even at work, despite the fact that the FDCPA says debt collectors cannot call a debtor at an inconvenient time or place, which includes calls before 8:00 a.m. Speak frankly and honestly with them about what can be done to pay back your debts over time while ending the harassing phone calls. Be aware that a lot of creditors will encourage you to use automatic bill pay, but don't cave to that unless you are certain you can make those automatic payments.

It can be stressful to get a call or letter from a collection agency. You must inform the collection agency in writing that they may not contact anyone but yourself as the debtor to curb those calls. Make all important correspondence in writing. Another way you'll want to protect yourself in this process is to make your request for a debt validation letter in writing, then send it via certified mail with a return receipt request. Contact: No collector or Collection agency may contact the debtor more than three times in seven days on behalf of the same creditor other than by traditional mail. The credit bureaus validation process is little more than contacting the collection agency with a, "Hey guys, is this correct? It is? Okay thanks." But you'll need to prove in court that the collector violated the FCRA knowingly. Sometimes that collectors are overzealous civil and will call you more than every day.

If the debt is indeed yours and the statute of limitations has not yet passed, you may want to negotiate with the company to pay less than the amount owed. If you aren't sure what actions are illegal or are currently facing harassment from collectors, you may want to speak with a local debt and bankruptcy law attorney. Debt collectors, upon request, must verify that they have a legal right to collect a debt. If you have received calls or letters from debt collectors, you may want to check your credit reports to ensure the debt is being reported correctly. Your debts may also be sent to collections, where debt collectors may also file a lawsuit and get a judgment against you. If they contact you again after you've sent this letter, you can take legal action against them. In this letter, do not acknowledge that you owe the debt.

Should the collection agency fail to respond to your dispute yet continue attempting to collect from you, you have the right to sue it for violating the FDCPA. The FDCPA does not place any time constraints on a collection agency when responding to a dispute letter. If you do not receive a response to your initial dispute, you must monitor your credit reports and document any illegal collection activity that takes place during this time frame. 9 p.m. Debtors also have the right to demand, in writing, that the debt collector not call at all,

and place all communication in writing. They are also not allowed to double or triple the amount of debt you owe them just because they think it's the right decision.

Under this act, the debt collector must stop calling or writing if you send the company a letter requesting an end to these practices. That outside company is covered by the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act. 2 Include your name and address at the top of the letter followed by the debt collection company name and address. Unless debt payoff was part of probate, debt collectors will call. Having said that, though, many creditors will honor the request. However, the timeline for having your debts forgiven by the law and by the credit bureaus is pretty long. However, that does not stop the debt collector from attempting to collect from you in other ways, such as by mail. If you have a joint bank account, however, the way in which the account was originally created could make a big difference, depending on the rules applied to your state. In the case of unsecured debt (debt without collateral backing), after collection attempts have been made by the original debt holder, they have the option of selling that debt to a third-party collection agency. Send a copy of the letter from the original creditor stating that the account does not belong to you, along with a formal notice that the debt has been sent to the wrong person, to the collection agency.
