What if you just did not pay, and did nothing after that? Some people may feel that doing nothing is better than filing for bankruptcy, and there are many times I will agree. To most people this is quite a worry since they start to imagine big shaven-headed blokes knocking on the door to take away their TV or car. Chapter 7 could cost you less than 2k from start to finish (I have seen costs less the 1300). You are able to discharge those credit card debts (and other bills), and once discharged, you remove any and all risk of being sued, or any type of bank levy, garnishment, and property liens. It is important to remember that you have what they want, and that's money. So, for example, if you keep getting hounded by a debt collector who's calling for someone you don't know, that's against the law. That's where Lemberg Law comes in. Contact the credit bureau when a debt comes back "verified" and ask how this was done. Similar to a collection agency, a debt repayment agency may not charge any fee for a dishonoured cheque unless the fee was included in the repayment agreement. A Debt Collection Agency is allowed to charge the debtor an interest, if that is its policy.

You may recover money for the damages you suffered, and the debt collector may be liable for court costs and attorneys' fees. If you can prove the violation and win, the judge can make the collector pay you for damages you suffered, as well as your attorney fees and court costs. Loftsgordon says. The objective of a debt collection agency is to collect as much as possible because the more money they receive from you, the more they earn. Send the original by certified mail to the collection agency or creditor, and have a receipt returned to you after delivery of the letter. Once you've settled on an amount, you want to ask for what's known as a "pay for delete." That means you pay the agreed-upon amount, and in return, the collection agency deletes the debt from your credit file. He or she can also help you file a lawsuit for FDCPA violations or pursue a bankruptcy. Consolidation can help improve your credit score if you make consistent monthly payments. Debt consolidation is another option when there are too many cards in question. In case you are not aware once you fall behind on your credit card debts the creditors/collectors do hold the legal right to pursue you through the courts to collect the debt. The regulations also require debt collectors to notify debtors of their right to dispute the debt, and whether the statute of limitations has expired. 6. If the collection agency decides to start legal proceedings against you, you must be contacted properly in accordance to federal and state law regulations. Today I talk with Blair Demarco-Wettlauffer, Managing Partner of Kingston Data & Credit, a collection agency servicing Canada and parts of the United States. Now, a collection agent can search databases like the Canada Post National Change of Address Database or Canada 411; they can also pull a full credit bureau on an individual over the computer. What's more is that databases exist that are able to pull information from social media accounts and other online sources to compile reports that provide a detailed list about you, at the click of a button. He explains that agencies can go in and pull a credit bureau scrub to receive contact information including addresses and phone numbers for thousands of files at once, within 15 minutes.

To stop this you need to send a letter requesting to cease calls. First, if a debt collector contacts you about a debt that you cannot or do not want to pay, you should send a cease letter instructing the debt collector not to contact you anymore and explaining that your income is exempt from debt collection. Upon receipt of the notice of dispute, the debt collector must cease all collection activities until their

case is reviewed to determine the amount of money owed on real debt, if any. The best way to stop creditor harassment is to speak with one of our debt collection rights attorneys. First, if you dispute the debt within the first 30 days after debt collector contacts you, you must stop all collection activities until it verifies that you are responsible for the debt.

If a debt collector doesn't know where you are, they are permitted to contact third parties to try and determine your location. Usually, they only do it after they've contacted other parties for information. Therefore, you should request verification of the debt in writing once you are contacted by a debt collector (which may be another financial institution). They also provide sample letters that can help you figure out how to word any correspondence you may have to send to the debt collector, such as a verification letter or a letter stating that you dispute the debt. Sending that letter may or may not be a good idea. If the creditor or collector cannot produce the proper documentation, you may ask the court to dismiss the lawsuit. Your attorney will be able to determine whether the debt lawsuit is valid. This essentially puts everything on hold until you receive verification, but you only have 30 days from when you first receive required information from a debt collector to dispute that debt. 2. Under the Georgia Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA), creditors can be sued for crossing the line from lawful contact to harassment.
