The Better Business Bureau offers a discussion of state debt collection laws, and lists California, Florida, Hawaii, Iowa, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Hampshire, New Mexico, New York, North Carolina, Oregon, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Texas, Vermont, West Virginia and Wisconsin as states that enforce the FDCPA against original creditors. Most consumers' addresses (and sometimes, phone numbers) have been sold to companies that collect mailing lists and sell them to collection agencies.

The debt collector is not allowed to ask details about your bankruptcy attorney-like whether you have paid them, when you are filing, etc. All they need to know is the attorney's name and contact information. If you decide to use an attorney to help you with your debt or to file bankruptcy, just give the debt collection agency your attorney's information. Federal law prohibits debt collectors from threatening you, but this doesn't mean they won't try to use fear to motivate you to pay off the full amount. 7. The letter was sent to the original creditor, however, not to the collector. You can also ask for more information about the debt within those 30 days, and the collector has to give it to you. Know your rights. Under the FDCPA, collectors can only call you between the hours of 8 a.m. 2. Know your debts. In fact, you should try to avoid having your debts sold to a collection agency at all costs. If you're not sure if you've received a letter or not, call the creditor. Some debts are too old to be legally enforceable, so make sure you've checked our section on 'debt too old to be recovered', to check if your debt could qualify. This way, you can check if they have unlawfully added extra interest to your debts. First, you can CONTACT US with your problem. A debt collection cannot contact you before 8am or after 9pm unless you give the company permission to do so. Debt collectors cannot contact you by postcard, use a false company name, or give false credit information about you to a credit-reporting agency. Just because a person owes a debt it does not give a person freedom to treat them however they want. The company, which does business as Central Financial Control, is a debt collection agency that primarily collects medical debt on behalf of hospitals, doctors and other healthcare providers.

Every collection agency and collection agent shall openly, fairly and honestly conduct the collection agency business and shall at all times conform to the accepted business ethics and practices of the collection agency business. For instance, an individual found slandering or defaming the products of a business can be presented with a cease and desist letter for slander. Occasionally they are friendly and understanding, while others can be downright mean and nasty. Sometimes they are reasonable and easy to work with, but others are rude and pushy.

They cannot discuss your debt with neighbors, relatives who aren't obligated to pay the debt, or co-workers. You cannot go to jail for bad debt. One false notion many debtors fear is that they are worried if they don't pay they will go to jail. Other allegations include trying to pay property taxes on the house when plaintiff was already paying them, and billing him for it after the fact. Of course, there is no law that says you have to talk to them, so always feel free to ignore their calls. If you have been approached by a collection agency for a debt owed, Dolman Law Group, advises you to check with the Florida Office of Financial Regulation to be certain that the agency is registered with the state. Federal law prohibits creditors from seizing all forms of Social Security benefits. Social Security payments, some pensions, several public assistance or benefits and some insurance or annuities payments are exempt from garnishment in Texas.

In order to alleviate some of the stress involved with such issues, you may want to consult with an attorney who can guide you through debt collection process in Texas and help avoid harassment of abusive collectors. Since your debt may have been bought and sold by multiple collectors, be sure to look at your most-current credit reports to determine which company to contact. An offer for credit from a bank, savings and loan, or mortgage broker generally requires your verbal or written acceptance of the loan or credit offer. Your best hope is that the creditor will offer to cancel the debt. The original creditor may be concerned about its own liability and offer to cancel the debt. In California, the federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act governs how and where collection agencies may act in this regard. Under the FDCPA, you have the right to tell a collection agency employee to stop contacting you. If you've been subject to repeated abusive behavior and can document it, consider suing the collection agency. If a debt collector breaks the law, document the violation as soon as it happens. You have a case if your debt is personal debt and you have been harassed by a debt collector (or original creditor in Maryland and some other states).
