Keep your original documents in a safe place for future use. Depending on the local state's laws regarding the enforcement of judgments, the creditor may be able to garnish wages, levy bank accounts, place a lien on property, or take other action to enforce a judgment. In Texas, debt collectors cannot garnish wages to repay consumer debt. 3. a valid and complete chain of assignment of the debt from the original creditor to the debt buyer seeking the default judgment exists, including documentation evidencing that the particular debt at issue was included in the assignment. If your company wishes to sell any accounts to another debt collection company, you must receive written permission from the original creditor before doing so.
