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Even though a debt collector may, in some circumstance, be allowed to call you at work, they may not reveal to anyone else that they are a debt collector or that you owe a debt. A debt collector will see this as just another excuse from a consumer who doesn't want to satisfy his or her financial obligations. They'll make up a company name, an amount you supposedly owe and harass you mercilessly - just like a real collector. If a collector shows up in person and you feel like they're harassing you (we'll talk more about that in another section), you're more than welcome to slam the door in their face or call the police.

The standard residential loan note for Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac (who together hold or guarantee over \$5.4 trillion of mortgages, about half of the nation's home loans) defines a loan as being in default if not paid on the due date (i.e., first of the month). Under this dynamic, when determining a borrower's rights under the FDCPA, it should first be determined when the loan came into to default and when the assignment to the loan servicer was made. It is often the case that assignments are made from one servicer to another weeks and even days before the foreclosure is filed.

They cannot discuss your debt with neighbors, relatives who aren't obligated to pay the debt, or co-workers. You cannot go to jail for bad debt. One false notion many debtors fear is that they are worried if they don't pay they will go to jail. Other allegations include trying to pay property taxes on the house when plaintiff was already paying them, and billing him for it after the fact. Of course, there is no law that says you have to talk to them, so always feel free to ignore their calls. If you have been approached by a collection agency for a debt owed, Dolman Law Group, advises you to check with the Florida Office of Financial Regulation to be certain that the agency is registered with the state. Federal law prohibits creditors from seizing all forms of Social Security benefits. Social Security payments, some pensions, several public assistance or benefits and some insurance or annuities payments are exempt from garnishment in Texas.

Several countries have laws in place to protect debtors' rights. The following comments apply to Ontario, but there are similar laws on the books in every province and territory in Canada - we've added some links at the bottom of this post to the laws where you live. Most phone calls and letters are considered harassing unless they contain an explicit statement about their purpose being debt collection on behalf of a particular creditor. Are you being harassed by creditors in writing or over the phone after your debts have been discharged? The law specifically states it must be in WRITING! 100% Free Legal Assistance: Harassing Debt Collectors must pay our fees in FDCPA claims. The FDCPA (Fair Debt Collection Practices Act) outlines when, where, and under what circumstances creditors are allowed to contact you - specifically over the phone. The Fair Credit Reporting Act (FCRA) determines how your alleged debts may be reported to the credit bureau in order to further protect you from abusive debt collection practices. Can't contact the debtor twice if receives "cease communication" notice: The debt collection agency can contact the debtor only once (via mail) after receiving "cease communication" notice to tell about any one of the following: - Further attempts to collect the debt are being terminated.

Make sure the program has lawsuit defense or a plan to resolve a summons and make sure the company explains this to you. There is no guarantee that creditors will settle for a certain percentage or that any program can remove derogatory information from your credit report. There is also one other exception called the Location Information Exception. Recently introduced legislation, House Bill 281, would require any lawsuits filed by debt collectors against consumers to contain clear information about the consumer's rights among other things. Once you finish making all of your payments, however, if you have made all of them on time and kept up with things in the time sense, your credit will drastically improve. But always keep in mind that they can't take your things illicitly and without proper documentation. Finally, if you give express permission to the debt collector to call you at work, you can reasonably expect those calls to keep on coming. Explain that you have to pay the landlord and utilities first and that you will pay your other bills when you can. If someone threatens you with a negative posting to your credit report if you do not pay a debt that is not yours, remind them of the Fair Debt Collections Practices Act.

If you have received no response by then, send a second letter, including the original letter and a copy of the return receipt proving that they indeed received your first letter. Finally, the FDCPA outlines procedures for civil legal actions available to consumers who have been subjected to abusive, deceptive or fraudulent debt collection practices. The FDCPA also outlines violations and penalties imposed for violations by companies and individual debt collectors. In addition to refraining from abusive collection practices, debt collectors can ensure compliance with FDCPA regulations by implementing a bill payment system that offers payment tokenization. It is always best to write a letter and keep a copy. If the debt collector does not send you a verification letter, it is illegal for them to keep contacting you. Unless verification of the debt is provided, the bill collector can't proceed with any further communication in attempting to collect the debt. Reach out to your state attorney general's office or the dept. of consumer affairs and try to find out if the collection agency is licensed to collect in your state. If you sue under this federal law and win, the debt collector must generally pay your attorney's fees, and may also have to pay you damages. Because there is a statute of limitations to every action, one might think that it was never unreasonable to bring suit before the statute of limitations had run. I suspect that laches might become an issue in foreclosure cases because these cases involve so much dubious behavior on the part of the lenders, and because the lenders have been so careless with the back-up documentation. The DCA can then legally initiate a collection process on past-due debts. If businesses don't pay outstanding debts within 90 to 120 days, the creditor may assign, sue, or sell the debt to a commercial DCA. If your business is having difficulty repaying commercial debt, a lawyer can help reconfigure business debts by negotiating with creditors to potentially waive part of the debt. It is smart to keep records of what was said and if you believe something may be illegal, contact a lawyer. Keep in mind, go off of the alleged complaint as well as client's memory. Collection agencies can't make false threats (wage garnishment, seizure of debtor's property, etc.) to businesses if a legal process can't or won't take place. Creditors and DCAs can seek professional help from debt solicitors or bailiffs, both of whom can call for the seizure of the debtor's property or transfer the case to a local or international court. Usually, it involves reducing your monthly payment and extending your payment term so you can eventually pay what you owe.

But having it show up as paid will make a small difference to your credit score and may play a positive role in future credit endeavors. Collection agencies are infamous for having in-house lawyers that write letters as empty as they are threatening. Just like the ability to charge interest, collection agencies also possess the right to add their own fees to your unpaid balance if the original creditor's contract included a provision for collection fees - which almost every new credit card agreement does. However, there are malpractices that are oftentimes abusive - which is why the federal government felt the need to implement a couple of protective laws against collection agencies and creditors themselves. If it does not, you can file a complaint with the government. 6. To further protect yourself and provide proof in case you have a file a complaint to the FTC for abusive practices, put every correspondence in writing. 7. If you negotiated payment terms over the phone, request the collection agency to send you what you have agreed on in writing. If you are recording everything in writing, feel free to send a letter with the details of any requests you have made to the collection agency.

Can a debt collector threaten to sue me or garnish my wages? § 1692, in 1978, Congress enacted the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA), codified in 15 U.S. The federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA) regulates the behavior of debt collectors, and even outlines penalties for those who break the law. If debts are not paid in a certain amount of time, debt collectors have the right to contact the debtor and take legal action to collect the debt. A debt collector cannot threaten to take any action at all that they do not truly intend to take. The firm has handled individual and class action cases involving: improper disclosures, improper identifications, debt collection harassment, debt harassment, billing during bankruptcy or while represented, and other FCCPA and FDCPA violations. That means your wife, your husband, your room mate -- or maybe even a total stranger (PayPal often links accounts that have no relation to one another and it is impossible to prove that to PayPal) must pay their PayPal debt or provide the information that PayPal was looking for in the first place. That's because the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act is designed to give consumers equal footing with debt collection agencies, and says that, when a debt collector crosses the line into illegal behavior, the collection agency is responsible for paying the consumer's attorney fees. 1. The collection agency the debt collector claims to work for has a title that makes the company sound as if its affiliated with the federal government. You could be sued by the Federal Trade Commission for violating the FDCPA, but that is unlikely. Debtors can file a counterclaim in an eviction lawsuit in state court or even a separate lawsuit in a state or federal court to collect damages (actual, statutory, attorney's fees, and court costs) from a debt collector. New York State regulations also provide debtors with additional protections such as the right to request "substantiation" of any charged-off debt at any time during the collections process.
