Sending a written letter to the Debt Collector demanding that they cease further calling you is the most valuable tool in your arsenal of rights for ending debt collection harassment. The current creditor should be the party calling. There are 4 laws which govern the conduct of a debt collector OR creditor when collecting a debt. You're able and willing to negotiate with creditors or debt collectors on a settlement plan that you can afford and stick to. There is no guarantee creditors will be willing to negotiate with you. Your creditors will agree to greatly reduce your debt burden in exchange for your commitment to make a lump-sum payment. Under this approach, an entity that acquires a debt and subsequently seeks to collect on it must be either a "creditor" or "debt collector" under the FDCPA with respect to that debt, as those terms are mutually exclusive. And if the calls don't stop, the collector must pay damages of \$500.00 per call, \$1,500 per call if willful. If consumer sends a written request for verification within 30 days, then the

debt collector must either mail the consumer the requested verification information or cease collection efforts altogether. Both bankruptcy and debt settlement can reduce your creditworthiness and lower your credit, or FICO, score for years. Bankruptcy chapters 7 and 13 are the two avenues individuals can use to clear their debts through the courts. Chapter 7 cases typically clear your debts, while Chapter 13 requires partial repayment. If your monthly debt payments, excluding mortgage or rent, exceed 20% of your income, you have a debt problem that requires action.

If the Medical Debt Collector is reporting negative information on your credit (such as an unpaid collections account), write down the name of the Debt Collector and the name of the original creditor or medical center. And if you haven't already, contact the credit card company and remove your status as an authorized user. That is not the same as being turned over to a collections agency, but it is an intermediary step as the company tries its best to recoup the money it is owed. Third-party debt collection agencies are hired to collect debt on behalf of another entity, like a creditor. Since collection agencies only get information, they really cannot hold up in court, giving you a bigger change of winning. Contracts often prohibit debt buyers from giving consumers the contact information for the original creditor or previous sellers. Then call the collection agencies' client and inquire on who the original creditor was. What if I just want to make sure the collection agency or debt buyer is legitimate? Make whatever payments are necessary to insure essential utility service is not disconnected. Also keep detailed records of your payments along with your original agreement. Also, keep in mind that these rules may not apply to original creditors (depending on the regulations in your state). Begin a lawsuit to collect the debt - This threat may scare you the most, however few creditors actually follow through because it is expensive to go to court and they may be unable to collect even if they do get a judgment against you.

What if you just did not pay, and did nothing after that? Some people may feel that doing nothing is

better than filing for bankruptcy, and there are many times I will agree. To most people this is quite a worry since they start to imagine big shaven-headed blokes knocking on the door to take away their TV or car. You are able to discharge those credit card debts (and other bills), and once discharged, you remove any and all risk of being sued, or any type of bank levy, garnishment, and property liens. It is important to remember that you have what they want, and that's money. So, for example, if you keep getting hounded by a debt collector who's calling for someone you don't know, that's against the law. That's where Lemberg Law comes in. Contact the credit bureau when a debt comes back "verified" and ask how this was done. Similar to a collection agency, a debt repayment agency may not charge any fee for a dishonoured cheque unless the fee was included in the repayment agreement. A Debt Collection Agency is allowed to charge the debtor an interest, if that is its policy.

Such information may be unlawful with regard to the company you are dealing with and also the agreement of the contract. The regulations also include procedures for documenting any agreement between the consumer and the debt collector to satisfy or otherwise settle the debt. You should only deliver this letter to the debtor's home address and any address that debtor motioned in the agreement. Consequences: This explains the legal action that may be taken by the creditor and the effect that such action could have on the debtor's credit if the letter is not responded to or debt not paid before the deadline. The letter should be addressed to the debtor's home address or any other address that the debtor has provided before. Although the debt is still legally acknowledged as being owed, the creditor is not able to take any legal action against the debtor in order to recover the debt. You still need to respond. If you find yourself losing your temper, just tell the collector you will need to talk with him later and then hang up. Congress passed the Federal Debt Collection Protection Act 40 years ago to protect consumers like you from harassment by debt collectors. In 1978, Congress passed the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA) to protect consumers from harassment over unpaid debt. Spoofing is treading on potential FDCPA violations according to the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, especially when the collector is attempting to impersonate an attorney or law-enforcement.

To contest the debt, individuals can use their bank records and payment history to negotiate the amount being collected. If you do not consent to being recorded, you need to terminate this call. I never answer any call that's not from a number in my contact list. Plus, these collectors should not discuss about debt to other people who receive their calls, though they are allowed to ask them about debtor's address, residence number and the place of employment. Be wary of collectors who falsely claim they are attorneys or government representatives, who claim that you have committed a crime, or who misrepresent the amount of your debt. First realize that you do not have to talk with the debt collectors when they call. Pursuant to state law, be advised that this call is being recorded.
