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In that case, GDP for that economy stays at \$500,000. While contacting for the very first time, a debt collector must inform you of your right to dispute the debt. Under the FDCPA, you have the right to protect yourself from any kind of violent or criminal initiative undertaken by the collection agencies.

Call you outside of the allowed calling times of 8 a.m. Debt collectors cannot contact you before 8:00 a.m. This is a form of harassment so you should report this to the concerned financial institution and you can as well consult a lawyer even just over the phone or through a lawyer's website contact form for clarification on what you should do next. They are able to help you understand how long a debt collector can harass you for, what is considered to be harassment by a debt collector, and how to report and stop harassment from debt collectors. However, they have had complaints lodged against them in regards to how they attempt to collect on their debts, as well as the methods and practices used in the claiming activities.

The debt collector must contact your attorney if you have one, rather than you. The debtor must be told that any and all information received from the debtor will be used to collect on the debt. Also, a junk debt may be passed to more than one agency to collect at the same time. Also, be sure to secure the debt collector's name, address, and telephone number. Ask the debt collector to call you within seven days to accept the offer or you will use the money on another debt. Debt collectors cannot call you multiple times a day, use aggressive language or threaten you to make a payment, but can they contact your relatives in regards to your debt? Get the account number for the debt he claims you owe, as well as the name of the original creditor if a debt collection agency is contacting you. Actions including using automated equipment for making phone calls, calling non-debtors or family members of the debtor, intimidation in any form, using profane language, making threats of violence, etc. are activities used by abusive debt collectors that are not legal and violate the terms of the outlines.
