The Federal Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA) protects consumers who have incurred family, personal, and household debts, including debts such as auto loans, credit cards, medical bills, and mortgages, from being harassed and abused by collection agents if they fall behind on their payments. The act is enforced by the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) and private attorneys to protect consumers from unfair practices of the third party debt collectors. Your account may then be placed with debt collectors who also attempt to reach you. 2. Reach a repayment plan agreement with the collector. If you do decide to negotiate a payment plan for a reduced amount of the debt, you may get a better deal if you try to work with the creditor and not the debt collector. Not only is there often time spent originally wondering if a payment will come through in the days following the original payment date, but from there the process begins regarding how to approach the debt collection process. First is the pre-sale process.

You can also check with your state attorney general's office for more specifics about time-barred debt in your state. "This will show where the statute of limitations should be calculated from," says Sonya Smith-Valentine, a consumer rights attorney and author of the forthcoming book How to Have a Love Affair with Your Credit Report. If you have reason to believe that the statute of limitations has passed on a particular debt, you should ask the debt collector! In South Africa, there is what is known as prescribed debt, and in simple terms, this can refer to an old debt that has not received any acknowledgement for three years or more. Collections are a continuation of debt owed and can stay on your credit report for up to 7 years from the date the debt first became delinquent and was not brought current. If this is the only means by which they can legally get in touch with you, they may speed up this process once you request in writing that they discontinue their collection efforts. After this happens, specialized agencies start the collection process. It's important to remember that collection agencies and debt collectors are usually third parties related to or acting on behalf of the original creditor.

Arguing that it was not required to seek a license to collect consumer debts under the Act, Asset filed a

motion to dismiss the counterclaim. For instance, creditors who use in-house employees to collect debt from their customers are not covered under the law, nor are federal and state government officers who collect debts for a government agency. In other words, debt collectors must adhere to a certain set of rules when they are pursuing consumers who owe money. "There are millions of people out there being threatened daily by these actions and I'm doing my part to try and stop it," he wrote to an FTC investigator in early 2016, begging him to hold Tucker accountable. Truthfully, you don't know who those people are and you don't know who wrote those letters. The bill is not usually a large one - the average monthly rate in 2012 was about \$29 for a single family home - but MSD, unlike other utilities like electricity, lacks the power to shut off service to customers who fall far behind. It doesn't have to be the latest one. One answer to this, according to some, is the limited cease and desist letter.

Thus, the proposal would count mere attempts to communicate by placing a phone call toward the seven-call limit. As advocates have pointed out, the proposal would allow a collector to call a consumer seven times in a week about a medical debt, and an additional seven times during the same week about a credit card debt. But assuming you want to work with debt collectors, you do have to let them know your restrictions. Don't let yourself be bullied by a collector. Don't wait until you have an overwhelming number of debts you need to be recovered. And how can this mortgage forgiveness be fair to renters, since they don't get a dime? Be suspicious of anyone who calls you on the phone and says they can guarantee you will get a loan if you pay in advance. Anyone who gives your credit or a loan is a creditor. It's a good idea to keep a record that you sent a cease and desist letter to your creditor so that if they contact you again, you can prove that you already asked them not to.

Consumers can send a desist letter to the collector saying that the harassment is a violation of federal law. Of all the debt categories listed here, this is the only one that can sneak up on you-one purchase at a time. Debt collectors purchase debts from the original creditors for much less than the value of the outstanding loan. A legitimate validation may also be a copy of the collection agency's agreement with the original creditor to purchase and collect the debt. Has a Debt Collector or Creditor Allowed your Phone to Ring Continuously? If you receive phone calls, either record them or make small notes regarding the contents of the call. The FDCPA outlines a code of conduct for debt collectors that is aimed at stopping abusive debt collection practices, such as incessant or late night phone calls, phone calls to a workplace, misrepresentation of debts, the use of profane language or threats of unintended legal action. In fact, with computerized phone dialers, ignoring the problem probably means they will call more often, not less. Debt negotiation is a bargaining process where a debtor attempts to reduce the amount of their debt or the interest rate on their debt, alter or extend the payment schedule or have late fees removed from their account in order to make their debt load more manageable.

The first step is to review the contracts, facts, and evidence with an attorney experienced in credit card lawsuits. If you are a debtor whose loan or credit card account goes into default, be prepared to face serious repercussions. A lawsuit we covered in June, for instance, alleged that a letter deceptively stated that a woman's debt would appear on her credit report for seven years when, in fact, the clock began ticking from the date of default, not from when she received the letter. They can also prevent unwanted communication from other parties seeking you out, including, for instance, debt collectors who have obtained your phone number by mistake. In particular, create a backup email address and possibly a Google Voice phone number. Nevertheless, if you are experiencing debt problems, tinkering with remote phone numbers and email addresses will not solve the problem in the long run. However, it's a lot easier to block calls to a secondary phone number (or change it entirely) than it is to deal with debt collectors. For clarification purposes, the Second Circuit added a false name exception to the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA).
