Under the RFDCPA, if a debtor informs a debt collector or creditor to cease communications in writing, upon receipt of the cessation request, the debt collector or creditor must stop communications, with the exception of an acknowledgement that communications will cease or a notice the debt collector or creditor intends to pursue a specific action. The debt collector must contact your attorney if you have one, rather than you. The debtor must be told that any and all information received from the debtor will be used to collect on the debt. Ask the debt collector to call you within seven days to accept the offer or you will use the money on another debt. Debt collectors cannot call you multiple times a day, use aggressive language or threaten you to make a payment, but can they contact your relatives in regards to your debt? Get the account number for the debt he claims you owe, as well as the name of the original creditor if a debt collection agency is contacting you. The Federal Trade Commission enforces the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act, which prohibits unfair, deceptive and abusive debt collection practices. Most ordinary debt consumers incur are covered by the FDCPA, including things like credit cards, loans, utility bills, medical bills, NSF checks and most other consensual consumer transactions. If you are not engaged in business in Texas or in a specific local taxing jurisdiction and are not required to collect Texas tax, it is the Texas creditor's responsibility to report and pay the state and local use tax to the Comptroller's office. Compliance with the Federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act and other state and local regulations is something we take seriously. Collect 6.25 percent Texas state tax plus any local taxes from your customer on the charge for your taxable service. If you do not bill your customer separately for the taxable service and it represents 5 percent or less of the overall contract price, you do not have to collect tax. If the creditor is engaged in business in Texas at the time the account is placed with you for collection, and if the debtor (based on last known address) is located in Texas, Texas tax is due, even if you perform the service from a location outside Texas or outside the United States. Even though the FDCPA is decades old, Brown insists the act establishes that collectors "can't do anything that's considered harassing. Post-judgment the creditor may be able to use powerful collection tools such as wage or bank account garnishment (depending on state law). Use threats of violence or arrest. Using threats of violence or obscene and profane language is also against the law. Hang up when necessary: if the collector is being rude or using profane words, does not say anything, or refuse to identify themselves, then hang up. A call log can be typed or handwritten and need only contain the number that is calling and the date and time of the call. If you are represented by an FDCPA lawyer and if the debt collectors also are aware of the contact details of that particular lawyer, then according to the law, these collectors are prohibited from calling you directly. In fact, there are specific hours when the creditors can contact the debtors. Debt collection agencies act as third-party companies that work on the behalf of creditors to collect the debt. Not unlike the guidelines put in place for phone communications, guidelines for written correspondence are fairly clear and straightforward in terms of what collectors can and cannot do. The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA) establishes a number of rules and guidelines federally to prohibit abusive practices by aggressive debt collectors in the United States. Fortunately, the test for whether a debt collector's conduct is "deceptive," "misleading," "unconscionable," or "unfair" under the FDCPA is NOT whether the particular consumer was deceived or misled; but rather, "whether the 'least sophisticated consumer' would have been deceived by the debt collector's conduct." 2 These aren't just empty threats.
