

# Fair Debt Collection Practices Act Dispute Letter

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All three kinds of debt collectors - internal collectors, third-party collectors and debt buyers - must follow the set of rules laid out in the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA). Unfortunately, some debt collectors are not above using dirty tricks, including misrepresenting, to collect the debt. Instruct the debt collector that you are not the right person to call and if they tried calling you again, they are crossing the line. Security clearance. A debt collector is not permitted under the FDCPA to share information about your debt without your permission with a third party, such as a security manager, supervisor, or commander. This is why the debt collector should contact the executor of the estate to collect, not the immediate family of the deceased. Certain laws are in place to protect consumer rights against abusive debt collectors, like the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act as well as the Fair Credit Reporting Act. These cases go way beyond what's needed to prod someone to pay their debts, like the one involving a Belleville, Ill., woman who was behind on a debt around the time that her daughter died. They must also go through the proper court channels of your state of residence to obtain one. You must report inaccuracies on your report within two years to have any leverage against an inaccurate report. Even if the Statute of Limitations window is closed and the debt has dropped off of your credit report (7 years), collectors are still allowed to contact you as you still owe the debt, they just can't enforce legal action against you unless they can trick you into reinstating the debt. These bits of data include full name and any known aliases or maiden name, last known address and phone numbers (home and cell), previous addresses, last known employer's address and phone number, your subject's physical description (a recent photo is helpful), make and model of car, driver license number, car insurance company, Social Security number and the names, addresses and phone numbers of all known associates including friends and family.

If they tell you that's not acceptable, then tell them you'll pay someone else if they don't play ball. The debt buyer can then collect on its own, utilize the services of another collection agency, repackage and resell portions of the purchased portfolio or any combination of these options. It is also illegal for collection agencies to tell a third party that they are attempting to collect a debt. Send your letter Certified mail, Return Receipt Requested. You can send a cease and desist letter to the collector telling them to stop contacting you - be sure to keep a copy of the letter, and send it via certified mail with a return receipt request so you have proof that the agency received the letter. They have no power or authority to actually help you. Go with someone who shows that they have integrity, experience, and genuinely wants to help you. You only have to repay it if you choose to repay it voluntarily. Sometimes when we sue collectors for doing this, the defense lawyers will say "Your client must have given her permission or else how would we have her cell number? They also must give you the name of their company or agency.

When they visit, don't open the door. You don't agree that you owe that much - or anything at all! 'Yes I know I have a debt that I will eventually have to pay, but I don't need someone harassing and reminding me about it every day.' Right? If she didn't pay, they were going to drag her to jail," Garrett recalls. 'We're going to drag you to jail! If agents are making illegal threats like jail time, deportation and physical violence, you can report the harassment to the Federal Trade Commission or to your state attorney general's office. Although a debt collector is not required to respond within a specific period of time, you should expect that the response will be timely. What if the SOL period has expired, but the debt is valid, and is there on your credit report? If you're harassed at work by a debt collector, getting her to stop calling you there is simple. Some people argue that once a debt is no longer within the statute of limitations, it doesn't need to be paid off. The federal law does not allow a collection agency to further ruin your credit in any other way. A collector cannot threaten to arrest you or garnish your wages in any way. In one case, a phony California-based debt collection outfit run by a man named Kirit Patel allegedly collected more than \$5.2 million in debts that were owed to payday loan companies -- or weren't owed at all, according to the FTC. One of the worst offenses listed in the FTC's lawsuit: collectors allegedly threatened to dig up the bodies of debtors' deceased children and hang them from a tree or drop them outside their door if they failed to pay their funeral bills.

If you've received a notice from a debt collector, but have reason to believe you don't actually owe that debt (or owe a lot less than they say you owe), federal law gives you a brief opportunity to force the collector to demonstrate that you do indeed owe this debt, and to stop trying to collect on it until they have verified you are the one responsible, and that the money is still owed.
