It may be months or years later when the phone rings and one of the parties is greeted by the monotone utterances of a bill collector reading a script off the computer screen. One example is if you owe a federal debt, such as a federal student loan or unpaid taxes, and your "creditor" is the U.S. If you want to take the most efficient path to getting all your questions answered - including which of the debt collectors using fake summonses was the one that victimized you - then it is highly recommended for you to seek legal counsel right away. Read the FCRA (Fair Credit Reporting Act) and the FDCPA (Fair Debt Collection Practices Act). Credit-collection agencies are allowed to call you on your cellphone provided they adhere to the stipulations of the federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA). Your debt is a private matter between you and the collection agency. According to the FDCPA, once the credit collections agency receives such a letter from you, they must comply.

A justified part of this mess is the involvement of collection agencies. As mentioned, any business firm that assigns the debt collection work to some third-party collection service, so that personal involvement is saved to focus on other aspects of business, it is always fruitful to have a look what the strength of the debt collector is.

Families with low incomes and limited assets may be eligible to obtain free legal services from a neighborhood legal services office. They buy debts from companies for a very low price hoping to be able to collect the full amount of the debt from you. Even as collectors try to recoup debts from millions of Americans struggling to pay their bills, a small but growing number of lawyers and consumers are fighting back against what they describe as harassment, unscrupulous practices - and, most important to their litigiousness, violations of the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act. Whatever the reason, you have rights under the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act. Peter Barry, a Minneapolis trial lawyer, is so bullish on the future of debt collection litigation that he holds several "boot camps" each year to share his secrets with other lawyers who want in on the action. Jack Gordon, who runs the fee-based WebRecon site, said it was no wonder lawsuits were increasing, because consumers were being bombarded with ads from lawyers when they searched online for information on debt collection. In fact, 8,287 federal lawsuits were filed

citing violations of the act in 2009, a 60 percent rise over the previous year, according to WebRecon, a site that tracks collection-related litigation and the most litigious consumers and lawyers on behalf of debt collectors.

Consumers who feel they have been victims of unfair or deceptive debt collection practices can file civil suits against the collectors - but they must do so within one year of the violations. Harassment and abuse are two things that no one should have to endure in any form. Specialized agencies employ debt collectors who are very well trained in their debt collection efforts, and are generally more successful in collecting debts in a timely manner than agents who perform both types of debt collection. The debt collection industry has grown exponentially since the late 1990s. This is due in part to the explosion of consumer debt that resulted from the savings and loan scandal, low interest rates, and the subprime mortgage debacle. These debts include personal credit card debt, medical debt, unpaid mortgage or loan balances, etc. These debt collection agencies are governed by the FDCPA, or Fair Debt Collection Practices Act, an extensive piece of legislature designed to protect consumers who owe money to businesses from unfair and unethical debt collection practices. You can let the debt collector know they are being recorded which might result in proper behavior.

If a debt collector calls the wrong person or misrepresents the amount you owe, they could be using unfair debt collection practices. But have you ever considered that your creditors might be using unfair debt collection practices? Even if you owe the debt, certain protocols have to be followed during collection attempts, and any debt collector that ignores them will end up owing you money instead. If you simply cannot afford to pay your debt, you may be able to negotiate with creditors to lower your interest rate, change the terms of your payments, or even settle the debt for less. But did you know that there are ways to get creditors to settle for less than you owe? It's illegal for a debt collector to make false claims about you or themselves when they are trying to collect a debt (e.g., say they are a lawyer or government agent, claim that you committed a crime, or misrepresent the amount you owe). With management you pay a fee to a consolidator and the rest of the amount given to them is passed on to creditors to make your monthly payment.

Yet others secure the services of vendors who use e-mail to send bills directly to your customers. The majority of debts for collections agencies relate to council tax arrears, car payments, parking fines, benefit overpayments, loans, credit cards, telephone bills, water and electricity bills. Some businesses post bills on their home page. Others outsource the billing process to a consolidator who maintains its own page for posting electronic billings. According to some EBPP vendors, conversion to such systems could reduce many business's billing costs by 50 to 75 percent once electronic bill payment becomes the norm for companies and individual consumers. Under the FDCPA, debt collectors cannot harass, abuse or oppress anyone they call or contact to collect upon a debt. Collectors cannot call you collect without telling you the purpose of the call. The distinction between the original creditor and the debt-collection industry is an important one, says the American Bankers Association. The watchdog agency, which is considering strengthening regulations of the industry and its conduct, says more than a quarter of the consumers it surveyed felt threatened by the debt collectors. The bureau is considering rules governing debt collectors' conduct, including how they contact consumers, and how they verify their records.

If a new creditor buys the debt from your original creditor, that new creditor can be deemed a debt collector if they bought the debt after the account was already in default. That means that the original creditor is not a collector for purposes of this law. Any person or company that takes on collecting a delinquent debt for the creditor is a debt collector. As for the debt they are calling about, this not issue since the delinquent or past due debts are not yours and neither is this creditor. Therefore, a collector should give you a name (though many do use aliases to protect their identity and this is legal) and the name of the company they are calling you from. Identity theft is a crime in which another person steals your name, social security number, or other personal identification information and then opens credit accounts, uses your existing credit accounts, or uses your identity to obtain other benefits.

I would also like to request, in writing, that no further telephone contact be made by your offices to my home or to my place of employment. The representatives will make several telephone calls on a weekly basis reminding debtors of the outstanding accounts.
