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Because consumers are so empowered under FDCPA most consumer attorneys will pursue a person's case on a contingency-type basis. The FDCPA will not apply if the debt is a business debt. Are debt collectors, credit card companies, and telemarketers continuing to use automated telephone calls after you have told them to stop calling? They can't publish or reveal to anyone else that you have an outstanding debt. Invalidated collection accounts are not permitted to be listed on a consumer's credit report. A free credit report containing information about his/her debts is provided once in every year. Credit Checks: Hard Pull vs. If you have no problem with the account being listed on your credit report, then you can ignore the call. You don't say what type of debt it is; you don't say who is doing the collecting and you give no information about your personal resources or other financial situation. Keep them talking but just don't pay. You don't want to give them the paint and the brush and let them paint whatever picture they want. If you have caller ID on your phone, write down their phone number and date/time of their call; if you can, take a picture of the caller ID display. The FDCPA prohibits debt collectors from collecting charges unless the charge is expressly authorized by the agreement creating the debt or permitted by law. "Finally, in some cases, collectors ask relatives to make a 'voluntary' or 'family' payment," the commission said. In summary, you want to make sure you pay your debts. Collection agencies are prohibited from taking some actions while collecting debts. I have a particular one that is calling my work phone after I asked them not to, they stop calling regular and started calling private, they have told me that they are going to garnish my wages, I will have to pay double and sent letters, and still have not taken any actions yet. Examples of harassment include repetitive phone calls, the use of obscene language and threats of harm. If you do not have an attorney, a collector may contact other people, but only to find out where you live, what your phone number is, and where you work.

Even if you don't owe the debt - or can't pay it - you should speak at least once with the debt collector to verify that it is in fact your debt being collected and not, for example, a debt that belongs to someone else with the same name or who once lived at the same address. Use any name or symbol that suggests the name of a debt collector on the outside of an envelope that is sent to you. A cease and desist letter is a letter telling the collector you are not willing to pay and/or to not contact you again. What do you do if the collector continues to contact you after a cease and desist letter? The collector (debt buyer) can

sue with no intention of proving its case but just trying to get a default judgment from you. Defendant has never been noticed or presented with any billing statements as described in the pleadings or the exhibits, and the defendant has never been served with any default notice as alleged. If you fail to respond or show up in court, the judge grants a default judgement against you.

Considering that collectors can find out the name of your neighbor's dog (ok - a slight exaggeration) - it is no problem using the many resources out there to find your cell phone number. A human collector comes on after a brief pause and asks you "What is your name? An exception to this rule is if the collection department goes by a different name than that of the creditor or service provider. They can reach out to your friends and family in search of your contact information, but they can't speak about your debt (with the exception of a spouse in some cases). If you are represented by an FDCPA lawyer and if the debt collectors also are aware of the contact details of that particular lawyer, then according to the law, these collectors are prohibited from calling you directly. As evident by an increase in consumer complaints seen by the FTC, debt collectors are willing to threaten and harass consumers in order to collect money.

A collection agency repeatedly calling you during the same day with an intent to abuse, annoy, or harass you or anyone answering the phone. Now your phone rings multiple times a day from numbers you don't recognize. I have verbally requested that these stop, but I am still receiving calls and I now require all further correspondence from your company to be made in writing only. Monitor your accounts and immediately report any suspicious or unauthorized purchases to your bank or credit card company. For example, if a spouse incurs a credit card debt, the other spouse is generally not responsible unless they were a co-signer on the debt. Protect your Identity: Be careful about giving personal information including a credit or debit card number over the phone and online. A number of provinces empower consumers to stop the calls by having a lawyer send a letter to the agency. However, an agency cannot threaten you on this pretext unless it really intends sending your report.
