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In addition to checking what's reported about you at the three major credit reporting agencies for free once a year, you can get free reports about yourself from some other national consumer reporting agencies, if they have data about you. All bureaus are required by law to investigate your dispute, usually within 30 days by contacting the creditor, collections agency or other information provider that supplied the data that is in question. Consumer debtors are in a tough spot in these types of situations as the damage has already been done - all without their knowledge. The FDCPA's definition of "consumers" and "debt" specifically restricts the coverage of the FDCPA to personal, family or household transactions (e.g., home loans). If an attorney is representing you about the debt, the debt collector must contact the attorney, rather than you. Once your account is referred to a real attorney, tread carefully. If you receive notification that the collector has sent your account to an outside attorney, take note. The statute of limitations is the time a debt collector has to take action against you - like suing you - for an old debt you haven't repaid. Remember, according to the FTC, it is illegal for a debt collector to reach out to you under false pretenses. If the creditor decides to pursue legal channels, the law firm they hire will reach out to the consumer before the lawsuit is filed.

The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA) prohibits debt collectors from using unfair, abusive and deceptive practices against consumers. You can also report problematic collection practices to the Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia. For example, a creditor is a debt collector for purposes of the FDCPA if (a) he/she uses a name other than his own to collect his debts, including a fictitious name; (b) has salaried attorney employees who collect debts and who use stationery indicating the attorney is independent or separate from the creditor (e.g., ABC Corp. In general, the FDCPA regulates the conduct of a debt collector, which is defined as "anyone who collects a debt." The Act applies to debt collection agencies or any other entity that is attempting to collect a debt on behalf of another. If you notice a payment is taken from your checking account without authorization, contact the collection agency and ask for the recorded phone call of the transaction.

A debt collector can sue a debtor but they are not likely to do so because of the cost and time that a court case would take. If you are late on these payments or stop making them altogether, you will likely hear from your lender via a letter, over the phone, or by email. If you do not abide by the court's rulings (for instance, failing to make the court-ordered payments), this can be seen as a form of contempt of court, which is a jailable offense. When you have payments due, every phone call or knock on the door can be nerve-wracking as you wonder if this is the moment debt collectors come to take away your possessions. You also have the right to notify them that you do not want them to call or contact you anymore. Debt collectors don't care if all you have is the money to pay your house note - they want to be paid and the house note not getting the money is your problem. While debt collectors and debt collection agencies can be difficult to deal with, consumers have more rights than they often know about under local, state and federal laws.

As for taking money from your paycheck, they can not attach you wages without documentation signed by a judge. There's definitely a risk of provoking them, especially if you owe a large amount of money. Debtors can file a complaint if the collectors threaten them with false lawsuits (which they never filed), ask for an amount deviating from the original agreement between the creditor and debtor. The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act, also known as the FDCPA, protects consumers' rights in the context of debt collection. Many professional debt collectors follow the rules set by the Federal Fair debt collection practices law. In July, five staff from the ANZ debt collection department were disciplined after The Age revealed they had set up a bogus Facebook page in order to track debtors. DMPs are great for creditors, but offer little value for debtors. Through those calls or letters, they may offer to let you settle your debt for less than what you owe. In general terms, the FDCPA prevents debt collectors from engaging in behavior that is "false, deceptive, or misleading" when attempting to collect on a debt.
