If the online bank is headquartered in a different state than the one where the creditor initially pursued legal action and obtained a judgment, the creditor may have to take additional steps to get a valid writ of garnishment where the bank is located. Collectors may not contact you at an inconvenient time, specified in the act as before 8:00 a.m.

For example a debt collector will contact you for a period of time and if they are unsuccessful in collecting payment that debt collector will report negative information to the credit bureaus and will sell the legal collection rights to another debt collector. The debt collector starts reporting the account on your credit report. If my experience is anything to go by, the debt collectors will stoop to harassment and lies to achieve their goal. Generally speaking, harassing debt collectors will either be violating the federal FDCPA or a similar state law. The government regularly hands down fines to these companies for violating government regulations. This action just delays the inevitable down the road. Make sure to designate several regular days per month to review and pay your bills - say the first or the fifteenth, then make sure you sit down at your desk to pay them, with your checkbook(s), a pen, stamps, tape, a stapler,

Just read some of the successful lawsuits filed by the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) against collection agencies. Collection agencies are infamous for violating the rules against constant and aggressive phone calls. Only third-party agencies are subject to these regulations, not your original creditor's internal collection department. While the debtor can usually try to negotiate to have the debt not be reported as charged off, or removed from the credit report, this negotiation works better if it is with the original creditor. There is also a California law called the Rosenthal Fair Debt Collections Practices Act (RFDCPA) that protects consumers from original creditors too. Yes, getting debt collectors off your back is nice, but you know what's even better? There have been lots of harassment incidents from debt collectors because many people do not really know their rights and the extent to which debt collectors can act according to the law. If you've been harassed by a debt collector, it's important to gather evidence. "A collection agency kept calling me about a debt they said I owed. Send copies of this documentation - along with your written agreement - as a reminder to the collection agency. These collection agencies buy debts from an original creditor that has given up on the delinquent account. You have a secured debt if you signed a contract that gives the creditor collateral (security) for the debt. Often, such cooperation only encourages debt collectors to become even more invasive and continue calling repeatedly. The mistake I see a lot of people make when dealing with debt collectors is that they think they have to accept the demands being made or follow all instructions to the letter regarding debt payments.

An aggressive debt collector can escalate the cell phone bills of consumers who do not have an unlimited text message plan. The position of many in the debt collection industry is that consumers who are behind on their bills are deadbeats, and that they'll go to any lengths necessary to collect every dollar.
