The Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act (FACTA) entitles you to one free report every year from each of the three major credit bureaus: Experian, Transunion and Equifax. Generally it's a good idea to send the original letter by certified mail, and pay for a "return receipt" so you can document what the collector received and when. Check with the original creditor. If a creditor does this and it can be proved, the collector loses the right to collect the debt. Should the collection agency fail to respond to your dispute yet continue attempting to collect from you, you have the right to sue it for violating the FDCPA. The FDCPA does not place any time constraints on a collection agency when responding to a dispute letter. If you do not receive a response to your initial dispute, you must monitor your credit reports and document any illegal collection activity that takes place during this time frame. 9 p.m. Debtors also have the right to demand, in writing, that the debt collector not call at all, and place all communication in writing. They are also not allowed to double or triple the amount of debt you owe them just because they think it's the right decision.
