Deal with your creditors before you are referred to a collection agency. You purposely stop paying other creditors in order to accumulate the money. Otherwise, collection agencies won't stop chasing you for payments. Further, they cannot threaten or harass you or misrepresent themselves, and they cannot call you if you send a letter telling them to stop. The debt validation letter puts the onus on the agency to prove that you owe the money. Allow the collection agency some method of contacting you. Contact you on their own and ask for payment using their internal collection department. Prepare an offer to settle the medical debt with a reduced lump sum payment. They may accumulate bills from several providers for a single medical event - a hospital, doctors, a lab and a nursing home, for example - and all could be in collections separately, potentially resulting in dozens of calls each week. If you owe less than the estimated minimum, then ignoring calls could be a valid negotiation tactic. The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA) prohibits debt collectors from using unfair, abusive and deceptive practices against consumers. You can also report problematic collection practices to the Office of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia. For example, a creditor is a debt collector for purposes of the FDCPA if (a) he/she uses a name other than his own to collect his debts, including a fictitious name; (b) has salaried attorney employees who collect debts and who use stationery indicating the attorney is independent or separate from the creditor (e.g., ABC Corp. In general, the FDCPA regulates the conduct of a debt collector, which is defined as "anyone who collects a debt." The Act applies to debt collection agencies or any other entity that is attempting to collect a debt on behalf of another. If you notice a payment is taken from your checking account without authorization, contact the collection agency and ask for the recorded phone call of the transaction.

This means they can't conceal or lie about their identity when they get you on the phone. Has a debt collector or creditor threatened you with hurting your credit if you did not pay? If you send the debt collector a letter stating that you don't owe any or all of the money, or asking for verification of the debt, that collector must stop contacting you. If you are contacted by a debt collector concerning a consumer debt, there are some specific statutory requirements that the collector must follow. Collection agency debt is any financial obligation owned by a collection agency. Consumers may not realize they have rights under the federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act, a law that also allows them to file lawsuits to collect up to \$1,000 from debt collectors that cross the line. You have 30 days to demand validation--don't squander it! If you have not received the written notice, the collection agency or collector must resend the notice to you at the address you provide and no demand for payment or another attempt to collect payment of the debt can be made until the sixth day after the day the notice is resent.

They can also call to inquire about the status of a court order for a wage garnishment, which requires automatic deductions from your salary. Requesting validation of the debt basically means that you are asking for information about the balance, date of last payment, identification of the original creditor, and who presently owns the account. But, you can be pretty sure that creditors and debt collectors aren't going to cut you a break when you ignore them. A debt recovery agency can send as many written reminders, as needed, or according to DCA's policy. A Debt Collection Agency is allowed to charge the debtor an interest, if that is its policy. A creditor is NOT allowed to charge the debtor a fee as a debt collection agency, as according to the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act and the Office of Fair Trading, such action describes the creditor as a first-party DCA. Just like the ability to charge interest, collection agencies also possess the right to add their own fees to your unpaid balance if the original creditor's contract included a provision for collection fees - which almost every new credit card agreement does. Examples of debts that fall within the FDCPA include personal credit card debts, car loans, medical bills, and home mortgages. However, this is typically a last resort for consumers who have high credit card debt and won't benefit from other debt repayment options. Finally, if the harassing telephone calls won't let you have any peace, you can send a letter asking them to stop calling you.

In situations where the alleged debt has been "charged off,"(declared unlikely to be collected) debt collectors have to provide debtors with a written notice within 5 days of the initial communication with the debtor stating the following: the name of the original creditor, an itemized accounting of the charged-off debt, any amounts paid on the debt since the charge-off, and the total interest, charges and fees. Attorney's fees are awarded whenever you win. If you have a legitimate claim against a debt collector, you will receive actual damages, statutory damages of no more than \$1,000, and attorney's fees.
