The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act is a federal law that regulates and mandates what a debt collector may do in its attempts to collect on a monetary debt. Record the dates and times the phone calls occurred. The notice must contain a statement that a breach of an obligation has occurred and set forth the nature of the breach. Failing to warn a debtor on every communication that the contact attempt is from a debt collector and that any information obtained will be used to collect a debt. A collector may not claim that property will be seized, wages garnished or interest or fees charged unless these actions are allowed by law. As unpaid bills pile up, as the interest grows on your debt, and as your earnings fail to increase, anxiety may consume you as you worry about the overwhelming financial burden you face. The proposed CFPB rule would prohibit debt collectors from suing or threatening to sue consumers for

zombie debt, but only if the collectors knew or should have known that the statute of limitations had expired. The New York State Department of Financial Services has particular regulations requiring debt collectors to provide additional disclosures to consumers. You may want to get assistance from a legal aid lawyer, your attorney, or your State Attorney General's Office. Debt collectors can't just do whatever they want.

However, they also target college-aged kids, working moms, and even people who make so little money that they've never had to pay any taxes at all. 3. And finally, your back taxes debt has to have entered the official collections stage, meaning that the IRS does want to come after you to collect, but it's been over a year since they've had any interaction with you. The key thing to keep in mind with these calls is that they'll only happen under a limited set of circumstances (not everyone who owes the IRS will be called by one of these new private subcontractors), and that they'll only come from a select set of companies.

There are some bill collectors along with a number of scam artists posing as debt collectors, though, who illegally harass and threaten consumers into paying their debts immediately. "Today's report shows that inaccurate information about debts continues to be a source of frustration for many consumers," said CFPB Director Richard Cordray. It is a surprise, however, that complaints against them keep mounting, even after federal regulators sue firms for the very things consumers complain about - trying to collect on debts that don't exist, calling at odd hours, contacting workplaces, refusing to provide details on an alleged debt, and so on. The Consumer Financial Protection Bureau regularly files reports about its complaint database - which has now logged 834,000 complaints overall. Both companies averaged more than 100 complaints each month between October and December 2015. And both have been the subject of enforcement actions, now settled, in which the firms admitted no wrongdoing but agreed to refund millions to consumers. We also have more than double the accounts of the next largest company, yet we have significantly fewer complaints in comparison. More than one-third (38%) of all debt collection complaints involved attempts to collect a debt consumers claim they don't owe.

Your advice would be appreciated. A record of all contact is important, and it will make it easier to report them if they violate the federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act. Make copies of all letters to the creditor before mailing. Provide an itemized list of any alleged interest, fees, or charges since the last billing statement from the original creditor. The original Fair Debt Collections Practices Act was developed in 1977, a halcyon time before email and text messages and cell phones and the internet. At the federal level, the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA) limits what debt collection companies can do when collecting certain types of debt. For example a debt collector will contact you for a period of time and if they are unsuccessful in collecting payment that debt collector will report negative information to the credit bureaus and will sell the legal collection rights to another debt collector. The debt collector starts reporting the account on your credit report. If my experience is anything to go by, the debt collectors will stoop to harassment and lies to achieve their goal. Generally speaking, harassing debt collectors will either be violating the federal FDCPA or a similar state law. The government regularly hands down fines to these companies for violating government regulations. This action just delays the inevitable down the road. Make sure to designate several regular days per month to review and pay your bills - say the first or the fifteenth, then make sure you sit down at your desk to pay them, with your checkbook(s), a pen, stamps, tape, a stapler, envelopes, a calculator and return address labels.
