Apprenticeship Program (Denver, Colorado)

- I was trained by Journeymen in the reading of building blueprints, using them to measure out the layout of where the pieces of iron would go and how to connect them via steel bolts or through welding.
- I was taught the basics of SMAW or stick welding and how to use it in various ways. I was trusted enough to weld flashing (aluminum covers) to the HVAC systems on the roof of the Colorado Convention Center, where I worked, using Puddle Welding.
- Utilizing classroom time, I was trained in the terminology and mathematics of iron working, such as the formulas that we would use to calculate our rigging layout when hoisting a piece of steel with a tower crane.
- In learning the terminology for each tool that we used in iron working, I began tool running for the Journeymen on the job, collecting what tools they needed across the job site to be successful.

Main office:

- I created orders that were given to me by the Billing and Sales departments.
- I built material lists for projects based on orders
- I reviewed building plans and ensured that they were to the specifications of the order.

- I was in charge of material destruction and recycling, utilizing the facilities wood chipper. I controlled daily general scrap wood clean up.

- Reading the blueprints and receiving orders from our foremans, I would assist in building mobile stages, set up/take down events such as conventions, concerts, and trade shows. I would work with truss connection and removal when it was needed. I would help with rigging layouts that including half ton and full ton motors. I would work with vendors at trade shows to build their booths as per their specifications, troubleshooting whenever needed.
- If the event needed carpet, I would assist in the layout and removal of however much was needed.
- I would assist in the building of audio layouts, across a truss grid, through speaker towers, or on the ground, making sure that all cables were set up properly.
- I would assist in the hanging of lighting set-ups, across a truss grid, or along the floor, making sure that cables were attached how they needed to be.
- I would assist in the building and wiring of video walls and the truss that they were attached to.
- I would assist in the building, rigging, and wiring of theater stage set-ups, following construction blueprints and making sure that everything was to required specifications.
