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Having old debt on your record can also impact your other finances, including your ability to qualify for credit cards and loans. Reputable debt collectors are supposed to follow federal laws, including the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act and other consumer protection laws. The Fair Debt Collection Practices Act states that until the company provides you with validation of the debt, it cannot continue any form of collection activity -- including reporting the debt to the credit bureaus. The Fair and Accurate Credit Transactions Act (FACTA) entitles you to one free report every year from each of the three major credit bureaus: Experian, Transunion and Equifax. Under the Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA), debt collectors are required to provide proof that the debt actually belongs to you and they must cease collection of the debt until they do so. They must prove in writing that they actually purchased the debt from the original credit grantor. Debt collectors can't pretend to be law enforcement officers and cannot use letterhead, envelopes, or a company name that makes it appear as though their correspondence has come from the federal government, a state government, or from a law enforcement agency if they are not working for that agency. If a debt collector can't prove

that you owe a particular debt, then they aren't allowed to try to collect it from you. According to Dunn, debt collectors are allowed to contact your spouse and speak to them about your debt. Has a debt collector or creditor tried to collect a debt that was eliminated in bankruptcy? For example, a debt collector cannot exaggerate the amount of money that you owe or try to collect a debt that you discharged (or wiped out) through a Chapter 7 liquidation bankruptcy. If you are not sure whether the statute of limitations applies in your case - the rules vary from state-to-state - simply ask the collection agency if your debt is "time-barred" meaning the statute of limitations has run out. While it is still your responsibility to square all your valid and legitimate debts, you don't have to endure illegal, harassing or irritating activities. They don't want you to know that they are merely fishing for information that will help them find you if you move, sue you if you don't repay, or get into your bank records.

The FTC also notes in its report that it receives more consumer complaints about debt collectors - including debt buyers - than about any other single industry, with many complaints relating to the quantity and quality of information collectors have about the debts. The FTC may take steps to sanction the agency if it has other complaints on record. A wider range of damages may be available to you as a result. The state agency may move more quickly to sue the collection agency or shut it down for egregious violations. Send a copy of your complaint to the state agency that regulates collection agencies for the state where the agency is located. Send the complaint to state agencies. If you get a call or a letter from a debt collector that is dated after the certified mail was received by them, then they have violated the FDCPA. FDCPA does not prohibit adding interest to the original debt.
