

Stop Harassing Collectors

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Because there is a statute of limitations to every action, one might think that it was never unreasonable to bring suit before the statute of limitations had run. The question there is, has so much time passed, even though the statute of limitations hasn't passed, that it would be unfair to allow the plaintiff to sue. It is probably possible to waive the defense by not asserting it in time. And I am not aware of any debt cases where laches has been argued and used as a defense. I suspect that laches might become an issue in foreclosure cases because these cases involve so much dubious behavior on the part of the lenders, and because the lenders have been so careless with the back-up documentation. Servicemembers are expected to pay their legitimate financial obligations in a proper and timely manner. Failure to pay a legitimate obligation may result in disciplinary action under the UCMJ, but only if certain conditions are met. Generally it's a good idea to send the original letter by certified mail, and pay for a "return receipt" so you can document what the collector received and when. While the FDCPA and several other state and federal laws do exist to protect you from unfair collection practices, there is still a long and scary list of actions that a debt collector can legally take against you if you default on a debt. The FDCPA says debt collectors can't harass, oppress, or abuse you or anyone else they contact. You can find the laws that says how much of your wages are exempt at 25-13-614, MCA. The law gives the commissioner certain specified enforcement powers including the ability to issue cease and desist orders, the right to take court action, and the right to hold a hearing and impose fines and penalties when certain state laws are violated. The laws are basically identical in what the agencies can do in trying to collect a debt.

Here are five things to remember that will keep you from being taken advantage of by debt collectors. Add a half-dozen bill collectors hounding you and things can seem overwhelming. Creditors and bill collectors can make it feel very difficult to deal with them, so you need to know what creditors are able to do in order to collect debts. Among the examples of bill collector harassment found were the placement of excessive calls to consumers outside the mandated window of 8 am to 9 pm. How will a debt in collections affect my credit? Request a signed copy of any agreement that you reach with the collection agency before making any payments on the account. Make payments on the debt as agreed. The collector is not allowed to contact you after that unless they can send you proof of the debt. Contact the collection agency and offer a payment plan or a debt settlement agreement. Upon receipt of the letter, the collection agency may only contact you to tell you that they will not contact you anymore or to let you know if they are going to take a specific action against you, like take you to court over the debt you owe. According to the FTC, "The FTC enters all complaints it receives into Consumer Sentinel, a secure online database that is used by thousands of civil and criminal law enforcement authorities worldwide." It takes action itself only for the most egregious abuses and illegal practices.

Yet the FDCPA does not explicitly address debt collection methods via social media, and the federal government recently changed the rules pertaining to social media use and debt collection strategies. Section 803 (b) If the consumer notifies the debt collector in writing within the thirty-day period described in subsection (a) that the debt, or any portion thereof, is disputed, or that the consumer requests the name and address of the original creditor, the debt collector shall cease collection of the debt, or any disputed portion thereof, until the debt collector obtains verification of the debt or any copy of a judgment, or the name and address of the original creditor, and a copy of such verification or judgment, or name and address of the original creditor, is mailed to the consumer by the debt collector. In addition to that, they must also foot the bill for the cost of obtaining the information from the original creditor.

The FTC, of course, has no ability to enact state legislation, and its ability to influence rule changes at the state court level is far from clear. For example, many of the recommendations made by the FTC would require wholesale changes to the rules of civil procedure and substantive rules bearing on state court collection litigation -- changes that state legislatures would need to enact. Still, if you send money into the debt collector to apply towards your debt, it's highly unlikely that the debt collector would refuse that money in front of him. Someone is considered judgment-proof when they do not have any assessable assets such as property or money in bank accounts. Various courts have reached different decisions, but there are a number of cases establishing that revoking any alleged consent in writing is effective. A number of debt collectors misrepresent themselves by claiming that they have legal representatives with them and that they may arrest you for committing a crime. This means that you do not have to prove any actual damages. And you should. But we both know that collectors are going to use any means they can to get you to pay.

The former is often referred to as a debt collector while the latter is often called a collections agency. If you are contacted by a collection agency about previous debts you had but already paid and settled, you may need to send a dispute letter. However once the creditor passes the account off to a third party collection agency which will happen anywhere between 3-6 months after falling behind things change. Private collection agencies will not ask for payment on a prepaid debit, iTunes or gift card. The FTC keeps a list of debt collectors that are banned due to illegal collection activity. What made FTC draw the line?
