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Who is calling you? In 2014, Capital One made headlines when agreeing to a \$75.5 million class settlement for allegedly calling customers cell phones without consent through an automated dialing system. All it takes is one violation, or one act of harassment, and you have a winning case. You will receive statutory damages in any successful case. Statutory damages for FDCPA violations cannot be more than \$1,000 (normally \$1,000 is awarded). Even if you can't prove actual damages, the judge can order the debt collector to pay you as much as \$1,000. Consumer Credit Protection Act (CCPA)-This federal law controls how much money can be garnished from your wages when you owe a debt. While creditors are entitled to repayment of loans, they cannot use improper, harassing or deceptive methods in their attempts collect debt, regardless of how much is owed. Federal decisions in the Court are binding in those states, and the decisions can be persuasive in other jurisdictions. The federal Fair Debt Collection Practices Act (FDCPA) lays out specific rules related to how debt collectors can and cannot treat you. Sometimes a collection agency may contact you about debts that are not actually yours. If you are sued, you are the Defendant in the case. In the case of settlement, you may be able to get your debt cut by 50% or more. This may be anywhere from two to ten years depending on the type of debt. This may be anywhere from ten to thirty days. Request validation of the debt from Discover Bank within thirty days of receiving notice of the debt. When all assigned Law Days pass, the lender files a Certificate of Foreclosure in the land records. In some cases, these "debt collectors" are nothing more than con artists who got your family's name through death notices or other public records.

The collection agents should not call the debtors in the working hours which are between 8 am and 9 pm. Moreover, the FDCPA only applies to third party debt collectors or collectors that work for creditors using a name other than the creditor (e.g. a collection department of a department store might call itself "ABC Auditing Services" instead of saying it's the collection department of Gimbals Department Store). Debt collectors cannot call you at unusual or inconvenient times or places. Calls at these times are considered harassment. If you're able to work with a collection agent, you should find them to be as flexible as they can be - provided they have a clear (and quick) deadline in sight for settling your account. Some of them are very polite and willing to work with you as long as you let them know what is going on and not try to dodge them. You have to show proof of your unemployment (by showing your eligibility for unemployment benefits) and you also need to work with their Career Strategy department to help you get a job. You can sue them for harassment and emotional distress, and most courts will generally side in your favor, as long as you can provide proof. If a debt collector violates these boundaries, a consumer may be able to collect damages of \$1,000 per violation.

If you get a call from somebody representing themselves as a debt collector don't panic. A company that is collecting its original debts is not considered a debt collector. "Debt buyers purchase these debts with all the rights, title and interest of the assignor to the indebtedness and therefore have the same rights as the assignor to pursue the debt," the debt buyers industry group DBA International stated in a paper filed with federal regulators. It's important to know that the law does not cover business debts or debts you may have incurred while trying to set up or run a business. Many states specify the interest rates that creditors, including debt buyers, can charge on a debt that lacks a rate set by contract. Debt buyers, not subject to Truth in Lending, claim the right to charge interest on the unpaid amount without sending you monthly statements. However, some debt buyers can obtain account documents to support their claims, while some courts, as in Texas, will accept sworn statements in lieu of original documents.

Consumers have several courses of action they can take to stop creditor harassment and hold the company responsible for its unfair collection practices. If they genuinely owe the debt, then credit counselling is one of the best lines of defence. Then they'll resume the calls next month about the \$500 you still owe them. FDCPA Sect: 805(a) basically states that without a court order or permission of the debtor a debt collector may not communicate with a consumer at (1) any unusual time or place inconvenient to the debtor (8.a.m.-9 p.m.); (2) if the debt collector cannot call the debtor's place of employment when requested not to do so, nor contact the debtor if they have been informed the debtor has retained an attorney.

Abusive debt collection practices have contributed to a number of unwarranted personal bankruptcies, to marital instability, to loss of jobs, and to invasions of individual privacy. If you use credit cards, owe money on a personal loan, or are paying on a home mortgage, you are a "debtor." If you fall behind in repaying your creditors, or an error is made on your accounts, you may be contacted by a "debt collector." Yes, some people run up debts and fail to pay what they owe.
